

WHAT'S AT STAKE FOR HOMECARE WORKERS IN THE 2024 ELECTION?

EXPANDING HOMECARE SERVICES

Kamala Harris has proposed a major new program that, for the first time ever, would allow Medicare to cover long-term home care services. This \$40 billion a year investment would greatly expand access to home care and allow millions of seniors and people with disabilities to get the help they need to stay at home, while improving home care jobs.

Compare this to Trump, who is on the record as saying there's "a lot you can do in terms of cutting" Medicare and has proposed raising the retirement age to 70. His tax plans would put home care on the chopping block to pay for tax cuts for the wealthy.

RAISING WAGES FOR HOMECARE WORKERS

As Vice President, Kamala Harris helped finalize a new Medicaid Access rule that will increase wages for home care workers. This rule requires that 80% of all Medicaid payments go to workers' wages, rather than being used by agencies for administrative costs and profit. This rule also gives home care workers and consumers a seat at the table in determining home care funding policy by creating state-level advisory groups that include workers and unions like ours.

Trump would harm home care workers and consumers by slashing Medicaid funding by as much as 30% and cutting millions of consumers from the program, jeopardizing care and jobs.



The future of home care jobs and services will be determined by the 2024 election. Kamala Harris has proposed historic investments into home care and will make sure that at least 80% of Medicaid funding goes directly towards workers' wages, rather than agency profit.



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
